If you observe an active threat or a medical crisis dial 9-1-1.

Emergency code blue phones are available in parking areas.

They provide an immediate voice and video connection to our security team, which monitors campus at all time.

Security will also respond immediately to situations requiring an AED.

Heartland security booth is located on the first floor of the Student Commons Building,

just outside the library. You can stop there to report suspicious activity,

or dangerous campus conditions, file a lost or stolen property report or reclaimed recovered items.

If you or someone you know has experienced sexual assault, domestic or dating violence or harassment or stalking,

the College has staff members who are trained to help and respect your privacy.

You can contact Heartland's Title IX Coordinator or the Dean of Student Support Services, in-person

Immediate Action Guides are posted in every room and provide instructions for campus emergency situations.

Tornado shelter areas are clearly marked. You can also take cover in other windowless spaces.

If a fire alarm sounds, faculty and staff will accompany you to the nearest exit.

You must use the stairs. If you're unable to do so, you can summon rescue assistance at each landing.

When evacuating everyone must move at least 500 feet from affected buildings and remain there until an all-clear is given.

Each faculty member is required to take roll and report missing students to Security.

Please stay with your group to help make that process swift and accurate.

Heartland Normal campus has loud speakers in every building for emergency announcements.

The College also sends text alerts about campus or severe weather emergencies.

Text HCC alerts to 292929 to sign up.

And if you have a medical, visual, hearing or mobility concern or condition that could be triggered by loud

unexpected sounds, you will also want to enroll in HCCalerts.access. That way you'll get text about things like construction,

painting or elevators undergoing maintenance.

Text HCCalerts.access to 292929 to enroll.

HCC doesn't charge a fee for either of these text alert services, and your phone number and personal information will not be shared.

Heartland's website, Facebook and Twitter, as well as local television and radio, will also have information about campus

and weather emergencies.

20 mile per hour speed limit is enforced on campus. Drivers must yield to pedestrians and slow down for buses or delivery vehicles.

Parking lots are identified by large letters on the light poles.
